We had a good turn out, not as good as last year but that was due to the fact that the Fourth was part of a four day weekend and that made for a smaller than usual crowd. PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE Allen Thomas

The 2006-2007 school year got off to a good start at C.H.S. despite a variety of challenges that resulted from the construction project and the damage to our computer network operation center, which was caused by the negligence of the roofing company.

The first phase of work on our science classrooms has been completed and our students are enjoying those bright, new facilities. The rest of the science rooms will be completed later this year. In the mean time, some classes continue to meet in the portable classrooms next to the gym.

We have a new fire alarm system. Our heat and ventilation system has been upgraded. Much of the back parking lot has been sealed and painted. Work on a totally new roof is almost done. Progress on the new 1,000-seat auditorium is going well and will be completed in the late winter or early spring. Several groups are anxious to be the first to use that new facility.


Many of the computer functions have been restored, but some will not be fully repaired or replaced for some time. Perhaps the biggest communication problem has been the loss of our web site. Not only have we been unable to post information, but also people have not been able to access links to various related web sites. There is now a temporary web site which is a significant step in the right direction.

We have received word that the Class of 2007 has two National Merit Semi-Finalists and 12 Commended Students. The Commended Students are Harrison Chen and Nathaniel Ledwith. The Commended Students are Daimeng Chen, Meghan Cramer, Kara DeFreitas, Helen Ferreira, Alexander Grant, Abigail Jacobs, Qian (Lucy) Lin, Visala Satyam, Ariana Spawn, Alaina Spaziani, Brian Tang and Emily Zhao.

Other academic achievements are worthy of note. 49% or our Advanced Placement students scored a 4 or 5 on their exams last spring. 78% received a 3, 4 or 5. The MCAS results from last spring are also exciting. 84% of the students received scores at the Proficient or Advanced levels in English and 85% in Mathematics. Only 1% failed the English and 3% failed the Mathematics on this first try.

I am pleased to inform you that we have received notice of financial assistance from the Mobil Educational Alliance through the North Chelmsford Mobil Station and Target's "Take Charge of Education" program. We also received a generous donation from a concerned parent. Funds such as these allow me to provide money to meet a variety of needs not addressed in the annual school budget.

I have already met with members of the P.T.O., the P.T.O. Liaison Committee, the Alumni Association's Board of Directors, the Faculty Senate and Principal's Advisory Board (students) to address questions and concerns. I have used the "Connect-Ed" telephone call system to communicate important messages. Communication with various segments of our community is very important to me. 

RUSS MANN

T WAS AS IF IT WERE ALL ARRANGED ON CUE. FIRST, THE HAUNT-ING RUMBLE AND THEN THE PIERCING SNORT WHOSE SOUND NO HUMAN COULD REPLICATE. THE BUFFALO OF CUSTER STATE PARK IN SOUTH DAKOTA WERE LOOSENED LIKE A RUNAWAY LOCOMOTIVE, WITH EVERYTHING IN ITS WAKE, VULNERABLE TO DESTRUCTION. WOE TO ANYONE OR ANYTHING IT WOULD ENCOUNTER.

Directly in the path of the rumbling menace was a lonely motorcyclist, temporarily resting from was to be a twenty-six day, 8359-mile adventure, a trip from coast to coast and back again. Wisely, he chose not to panic, even though he and his machine seemed certain to be destroyed. Buffalo raced to the left and right, but one Bull Moose set his sights directly on him. Suddenly, without explanation, the monster planted his feet and stopped just twenty feet short of his target. Remaining calm in the face of destruction had saved the cyclist's life.

The driver-owner of the motorcycle was Russ Mann, Class of 1965. Whereas some locals would relieve their boredom by going to Kimball's for ice cream, taking in a movie, or visiting grandchildren, Russ chose to spend his summer on a more dramatic note. He would motor westerly until he crossed the fabled Golden Gate Bridge in San Francisco. The Orange Jewel finally became a reality.

What surprised Mann most about his sojourn was the kindness and generosity of the people he encountered and how the people were attracted to his motorcycle. Fellow cyclists and noncyclists alike were piqued with curiosity and admiration of this vehicle. The kindness and generosity of these



same people was gratifying. Russ has advice for those who would motor westward. Initially, "don't rush." Spend an extra day or more enjoying a particular site. Also, take measures to avoid dehydration. Temperatures can reach one-hundred degrees in various sectors of the country. There can be drastic changes in these temperatures. Wild animals can be a menace, on or off the highway. While such a trip may leave memories that last a lifetime, it should be taken with care and preparation.

Russ regrets most of his academic performance – or lack of it – in high

school. He was not motivated to excel. Once he had left high school and experienced junior college preparation, he returned to academe and recorded honor roll grades at the University of Massachusetts.

Mann did not lack for favorite teachers while in high school. George Simonian was a particular favorite because he was "so animated." Others abounded. Don Boucher, Ed Quinn, Helen Poland, and Jack Sargent, to name a few. His parents had taught him that teachers were to be respected.


As a teacher at Nashoba Valley Technical High School in Westford, Russ sees an "absolute" difference between today's students and students of his day. While some remain respectful, others are not. They have no personal misgivings about their own behavior. They have no laments. It's others who are strange.

Russ was involved in a myriad of pursuits once he left high school. He attended Northeast Broadcasting School with visions of becoming a television personality. He worked at radio station WLLH. From there followed a four-year stint in the United States Air Force, a move to California and an eventual return to Chelmsford.

He describes Chelmsford as a once quiet, model small town that has lost this status. It has not been able to handle change to its advantage. Nature and the beauty of the landscape have given way in the interest of progress. Uncontrolled growth remains the biggest problem facing the town today and Russ sees no means of a process to control it.

Mann is unhesitant in proclaiming terrorism and immigration as the biggest problems facing the United



Russ need not look to statesmen, authors, entertainers, or athletes for persons to admire. The answer is to be found closer to home. His parents were his best teachers, best friends, and best guidance. They taught children good values. They were always there. It is they who are to be admired.

Russell Mann has had a variety of life's experiences from which he was gained wisdom. He seeks remedies to problems, rather than despair over their irresolution. 


ATHLETIC CORNER

All seven potential state tournament-qualifying teams this spring at CHS did qualify. These included baseball, boys' and girls' lacrosse, boys' and girls' tennis, and boys' volleyball. Four spring track members qualified for the National Track and Field Meet: Tim Eynatian, Josh Andrews, Michael Sweeney, and Chris Brown as the one-mile relay team, and Andrews in the 5000 meter run.

Fifty-two athletes were chosen as All-Star or All-Conference Athletes in the Merrimack Valley Conference. Fourteen were selected as Lowell All-Stars, and Greg Bailey was all-state champion in the 100 meter dash.

For the 2005-2006 year, these statistics are of interest. The girls' gymnastics team was State Champions. CHS had four Merrimack Valley champs: girls' volleyball, gymnastics, wrestling, and boys' swimming and diving. For the year, the sixty-six athletic teams fielded amassed a record of 245 wins, 153 losses, and nineteen ties.






