






The Hall of Fame gained nine new and wonderful members. These individuals did not get here by themselves; everyone of us can share in their success. The administrators and alumni who went before them, as well as the administration and students who were there during their time at CHS, helped to create the atmosphere that let them be individuals who were deemed worthy to be elected to the Hall of Fame. PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Al Thomas

The students didn't return to the same old Chelmsford High School this September. Several major changes took place over the summer. The stairs at the end of the two wings of the school were rebuilt and enclosed. Now students can move up and down the stairs without going outside in poor weather and those entrances will be locked during the school day. New carpets were installed in the three house offices and the main office of the school. The installation of new lockers was started and will continue into the early fall. A "buzz-in" system was installed at the front door and the main office was reconfigured so that visitors can be buzzed-in during the school day. The library was totally renovated and is now one of the most up-to-date facilities in town. The former Community Education Office has been converted into a second conference room with an office for Carol Pilat, Director of Guidance, in the back.

The freshman "Kick-Off Program," that was introduced last year, will continue this year with an emphasis on maintaining the relationship between student and mentor throughout the year. Members of the high school administration and

Rob Russo, Director of Activities, presented a workshop on the program at the Massachusetts Secondary School Administrators Association summer institute.

The high school schedule was modified to create a thirty minute "PLUS Block" each day. There are three major purposes. One is to provide an adult mentor for each student, as required by our accrediting agency. A second is to provide academic support for struggling students. The third is to provide time to do "school business" so that class disruptions will be greatly reduced.

Several major committees will continue their work during the 2008-2009 school year. The schedule committee will present information gathered from several other school districts and lead the faculty in consideration of a new schedule for 2009-2010. The professional development committee will finalize plans for 2008-2009 and develop detailed schedules for the early release day and full professional day that are planned for this year. The assessment committee will continue to consider ways of assessing the completion

4. Establishing an accessible place for its members to assemble and as a repository of historic memorabilia and records to house the offices of the Alumni Association.





CHS ALUMNI PROFILE

LGH SCHOOL OF NURSING



I'm sending a picture of some of our classmates, some of whom entered the LGH School of Nursing in September of 1950.

My sister Jacky came across it tucked away in her archives. I got a little information about their careers in nursing.

Barbara Bovill Hoppe: After marrying, she and husband Dick lived in Minnesota for seven years, where she was a school nurse. Then they moved to California. Barbara worked at West Hill Hospital in the administrator capacity for Blue Cross Blue Shield, also monitoring doctors as far as quality care was concerned. Her husband says she worked tirelessly in her nursing duties. Barbara also was the first school nurse that Our Lady Elementary in Canoga Park, California ever had. She also started a swim team in that school on which her four children competed. Unfortunately, as you may know, Barbara passed away in the fall of

2007 from cancer. Also sadly Barbara and Dick's youngest daughter Doreen passed away in January of 2008 from breast and brain cancer. Their daughter Denise is an ovarian cancer survivor; we're wishing her the best. Her daughter Deborah and son Douglas are fine, thankfully, as is her husband Dick.

Unfortunately, I've been unable to contact Priscilla Lovering at all for any of our reunions or for information concerning her nursing career. I was also unable to get any further information from Joan Guerrero Coston.

Edna Rose (I don't know her married name) left the course and married her Navy man sweetheart and moved to South Carolina. Edna passed away several years ago.

After Martha Warren Pohl graduated from LGH in 1953, she worked at Mass General Hospital until 1956.

She moved to Cleveland, Ohio and lived there from 1957-1961. She was not involved in nursing in the years between 1961 and 1971 in Ottawa, Ontario. Martha and family returned to Massachusetts in 1971. Between 1974 and 1986 she worked at several Long-Term Care facilities. From 1988 to 1990 she held non-nursing positions with an agency that provided adult day care services for frail elders. Martha retired in June of 1999 and is hopefully enjoying every moment.

Jean Sanderson Roberts stayed at LGH for four years after graduation as a nurse. I'm not sure if she married here or in Michigan, where she was involved in Special Education for 26 years. She tells me she thoroughly loved her job. She has been retired for fifteen years. She has two daughters also in the nursing field. Barbara's husband passed away four years ago. Like the rest of us, she spent her winter shoveling snow.

Marilyn Ullom Mason lives in Ashland, NH with her husband and two sons. She worked for 20 years for a state-owned elderly facility in Plymouth, NH. Now she is office manager for her two sons in their property maintenance business. In her spare time Marilyn is a quilter. Her group makes quilts for Habitat for Humanity and also for the homeless people. Her expertise is quilting art. It's creating a picture with cloth instead of on a canvas. Her group also travels to quilt shows and recently has been in Pennsylvania. I haven't seen her quilts, but I have seen quilt art, and it is beautiful as well as amazing. ■

FINE AND PERFORMING ARTS REPORT

IN THE ARTS

CHELMSFORD HIGH SCHOOL PERFORMING ARTS CENTER OFFICIALLY OPENS

In May of 2007, Chelmsford High School officially opened the state of the art Performing Arts Center. The new facility is a welcome addition to the Chelmsford High School building and is something many students and faculty have been anxiously awaiting.

The road to completion of this great facility began when the town of Chelmsford voted to support a 31 million dollar capital project. This project would ultimately include the addition/renovation of both middle school libraries, the science labs, floors, upgrades at both Middle Schools and High School, and the addition of the new auditorium.

The ground breaking ceremony took place on a cold and windy afternoon in the Fall of 2005 in an area directly behind Hawthorne House in the parking lot. Attending were local politicians, administrators, and several music faculty members. At the ceremony, several speakers talked about the collaborative effort between the town and schools to make this piece of the project a reality for our students and school.

Shortly after ground was broken, progress immediately began. From the Hawthorne House Office, music faculty members could watch as the initial foundation was poured and

watched as the stage area began to come into focus. Even during the winter months, the progress was swift and before we knew it, the basic structure was in place.

As things took shape, other decisions were made in terms of colors for the seats, stands, chairs, and even the purchase of a new grand piano for the stage. This was an exciting time for our school and especially our Fine and Performing Arts Department.

The building was completed on time in March of 2007 and a committee was formed to plan the official opening of the facility. The committee agreed that the focus of the opening should be on the high school students who have been waiting for this facility and who will benefit for many years to come.

The first Sunday in May of 2007, the Chelmsford High School Performing Arts Center was officially opened. Students from the CHS Orchestra, Chorus, and Band performed throughout the ceremony in addition to several speakers. At the end of the ceremony, a reception was held and attendees had the opportunity to tour the entire facility.

Since the opening in May of 2007, the Performing Arts Center has been used almost on a daily basis. Not only are concerts, musicals, and shows presented by the Music Department, but many other classroom teachers use it for guest lecturers,

class meetings, and other events. It has been an amazing addition to Chelmsford High School and has enhanced the learning process for all of our students.

I welcome all Alumni to stop by and see our new facility. I would be more than happy to give you a tour and see this wonderful addition to our school system. On behalf of our students, faculty, and school community, I thank all of you for your continued support of our programs and specifically this project. ■

- FAST FACTS of the new Performing Arts Center:
- There are 1,000 audience seats including handicapped accessible seating
- There are two dressing rooms located in back of the stage.
- There is a state of the art “fly” system which allows scenery to be lowered and raised onto the stage
- There is a workshop located backstage for set building
- The colors on the outside of the building represent the three “houses” at Chelmsford High School
- There is a professional “orchestra pit” in front of the stage so the pit orchestra for musicals will not obstruct an audience view.

TENTH ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS NIGHT

On a table in the foyer of the Chelmsford High School Performing Arts Center sat trays of cheese, crackers and fresh fruit. On another, this one on the stage of barely year-old, state-of-the-art auditorium, rested \$53,275 in scholarship checks. Sweet!

That was this year's take from the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association's Tenth Annual Awards Night held May 12.

"The driving principle of the association is that the alumni give back," association President Terry McSheehy, Class of 1964, said in his opening remarks.

The organization has certainly done that, giving away a total of \$315,450 to date to deserving students. While this night was just the tenth official ceremony, and the first held in the new performance center, scholarships have been awarded since 1993, when \$350 was awarded as the brainchild of the late George Parkhurst, a noted town historian.

With an endowment that now exceeds \$1 million, the group gave away individual scholarships this past spring ranging from \$250 to \$4,000 apiece.

"It's very gratifying," association Executive Director George Simonian said of how much the alumni have boosted the scholarship fund. "Giving back. It's what it's all about," the school's former longtime principal beamed, as parents and recipients noshed on the tasty spread in the lobby following the ceremony.

"A ceremony like this does not take place anywhere else in Massachusetts," current CHS Principal Allen Thomas said, in his welcoming remarks to the gathered crowd. He noted how the school receives widespread community support for all of its programs, from athletics to theater to education, but "none more important than the scholarship fund."

"You are fine young men and women. You have made us all proud," Thomas continued. "When you are successful, please support this group so others can go on" to college.

One of those moving on is the Class of 2008's Male Athlete of the Year Tim Rich. Rich took home the Michael A. Caito Memorial Scholarship, given to a student who excelled in football, as well as the brand new Randall A. Whitehead Wrestling Scholarship.

In presenting the award to Rich, Whitehead, a former CHS wrestling coach and athletic director, raised Rich's hand above his head, just as a referee does when awarding the victory in a wrestling match, prompting an extra enthusiastic burst of applause as well as a few chuckles.

In an interview as happy parents and students shuffled past him, making their exits afterward, Rich said he was humbled by the scholarships.

"Coach Caito and Whitehead are two of my idols," Rich said. His father, Bruce Rich, inherited the CHS football squad from Tom Caito, dad to the late Michael Caito, and replaced

Whitehead as wrestling coach some years ago.

The younger Rich, a standout quarterback at CHS last fall as well as a state champion wrestler, plans to attend prep school at Northfield Mt. Herman and ultimately college where he hopes to wrestle and perhaps pursue a career as a gym teacher.

"Maybe I'll take my dad's job," Rich mused.

Rich wasn't the only student taking home one of the 89 awards given out that night.

Erin Hehn, class of 2005, a history major at Holy Cross with a minor in Italian, received the Bains Family Scholarship, which was established the year she graduated.

Hehn, who has her sights set on law school next year, said the scholarship helps pay for "books and stuff like that."

Hehn's younger sister, Cara, named Female Student of the Year at a separate CHS ceremony, took home a Delaney Family Memorial Scholarship, an Al Thomas Swimming Scholarship, as well as a Fox Family Scholarship.

The younger Hehn, who plans to study animal science at the University of New Hampshire this fall with an eye toward a career in veterinary medicine, was a little overwhelmed by all the attention.

"It's fun," she said, of sharing the stage and accolades with her sister.

But the scholarships do more than merely give graduates a leg up on their campus expenses. It perpetuates the memories – and deeds – of those they are named for.

“It’s awesome,” said Judy Olsson, wife of the late Carl Olsson for whom one of the alumni association scholarships is named. “It keeps the memory alive.” And with Olsson, there are many good memories.

Carl Olsson, a standout runner at Chelmsford High for whom a track is named, later served on the town’s School Committee for several terms, winning his first election in a landslide in 1983. He was also a popular teacher and administrator in Wilmington. Students from either system are eligible for his scholarship.

“No other high school does something

like this,” said Judy Olsson, whose beloved husband lost a courageous battle to cancer in 1995.

Olsson isn’t the only one proud to keep a loved one’s contributions alive in the public consciousness.

Stephen and Judy Zabierek, parents of fallen Marine Lance Corporal Andrew Zabierek, established a scholarship in their son’s name in 2005 after he was killed in the war in Iraq.

“It means everything to us,” said Stephen Zabierek. “It’s great to see these kids smile.”

Andrew Zabierek, a 1996 graduate of CHS, “joined the Marines to do something meaningful,” Judy Zabierek said, as she and her husband stood with Chelmsford resident Jacy Dawn, a rising country music star who performs a

concert each fall to benefit the Zabierek Scholarship. (At this writing, this year’s show was planned for Oct. 25 in the same performing arts center.)

Any individuals or groups can establish Chelmsford High School Alumni Association scholarships with a minimum donation of \$5,000. The donation becomes the principal of the fund, and scholarship awards are derived from the accrued interest. Criteria are established by the association’s board of directors with the donors.

“I never really thought about how it would grow,” Simonian said, shaking his head in a post-ceremony interview.

“You take, but you’ve gotta give back,” Simonian said. “That’s the beauty of life. I’m looking to the day we can give every kid a scholarship.” ■


