

Exciting Times For Chelmsford High Alumni

It's been an exciting start to winter for the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association. Not only did the Hall of Fame nominating committee recently unveil its 21st group of honorees to be inducted March 26 (more on that later), but the Board of Directors also authorized spending nearly \$8,000 of its operating budget to embark on a bold new endeavor: a massive overhaul of the organization's website. The board voted unanimously to hire the Discovery Communications Group of Salem, N.H., to help bring www.chsalumni.org into the 21st century. If the project was a television show, it might be called, "Extreme Makeover: CHSAA web edition."

In addition to replacing the sleepy, basic format of the existing site, the folks at Discovery are working to make the site more attractive and user friendly, with easy and practical links to a host information, ranging from Hall of Fame inductees, scholarship winners, class news, how to donate to the organization, its scholarship endowment or its capital campaign. At some point, you'll even have nifty links to Lion's Pride content if you would rather read the magazine online, as many of our younger members might like



to do. And that's a big part of why we are doing this. As impressive as it is to have an association of roughly 1700 members like ours, it won't survive without new blood, new ideas and future commitment and energy.

Growing the association is just one goal of the web overhaul. By linking to our website through Facebook, Twitter, Linked In and other social media, we hope to reach CHS alumni far and wide - not only around the country, but around the world. The hope is that by offering alums instant access to news - big and small – we will attract people who want to help the association, either through active participation in alumni association events, or by donating money to the endowment fund or capital campaign. It would be pretty cool to see Chelmsford Alumni Hall standing a stone's throw from CHS a couple of years from now, wouldn't it?



- 4. Establishing an accessible place for its members to assemble and as a repository of historic memorabilia and records to house the offices of the Alumni Association.


* PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE *

♣ PRINCIPAL'S REPORT *

I wish everyone a Happy New Year 2011. Chelmsford High School has had a wonderful fall season with a lot of successful experiences for our students and staff. CHS continues to be a model for many districts to follow, whether it is in academics or extra-curricular opportunities. Our teachers and students continue to be recognized as outstanding individuals who demonstrate dedication and commitment to both their personal and professional goals. The CHS community continues to work closely with the entire Chelmsford community which encourages supportive and positive relationships between both groups.

In the 2009-2010 school year we had over 1,400 of our students involved with one of our athletic teams. There were more than 31 varsity programs and 36 sub-varsity programs comprised of 34 male teams and 33 female teams. We had MVC Champions in gymnastics. Our swim team went on to compete and place third at the State level, and our volleyball team went on to compete at the tournament level. The traditional spirit week and pep rally was a wonderful celebration of all of the athletic programs we offer at CHS. The students celebrated in a demonstration of school spirit and unity. The finale to the fall season was when our football team had their best ever win at our Thanksgiving Day home game against Billerica. These wonderful opportunities for our students were due to the successful athletic program we have due to the efforts of our Athletic Director, Jack Fletcher.



In the Performing Arts Department, CHS hosted its first production that included alumni, faculty, and current students called "Head of the Class". The production was an original play written by one of our own faculty members Lauren Cochran, under her pen-name of Eloise Hoffman. The CHS fall and winters concerts have been an amazing display of our talented students guided by our dedicated staff.

Since September, Chelmsford High School had hosted administrative teams from over seven high schools who came to visit and observe many different aspects of our school. Some schools came to observe our Learning Commons, our new schedule, our PLUS Block, and our Fine Arts/Practical Arts programs. It is quite an honor to have other school communities feel that CHS has so much to offer, whether it is concerning our facility or our curriculum. Many CHS administrators have also participated in NEASC evaluations (New England Accreditation of Schools and Colleges), visiting other schools in New England in order to understand the procedure of the selfstudy accreditation.

The National Honor Society inducted over 120 students this year into the society. These students met very demanding guidelines for academics, leadership, character, and community service in order to be included in this prestigious society. The Foreign Language Honor Societies raised over \$1,500 for the Lowell Sun Santa Fund.

The health classes will visit Shriners Hospital in January to deliver the \$3,600 that they raised for the hospital in just over a couple weeks. For the last eight years the same health teachers have sponsored this fundraiser which has totaled over \$31,000 in donations to date! A very special thank you goes to CHS Health teachers Maura Devaney, Matthew Dibble, and Rebecca Kobrenski for their support and commitment to their students and the Shriners Hospital. These are just a few of the charitable organizations local and world wide that our students support. The Health Department also worked with members of the community to sponsor a Drug Awareness week for our students and parents. The Live Smart Coalition and the Chelmsford Police Department paired up to promote a week of awareness for the students and parents in our community. Officers Rebecca Tyros and George Tyros met with all of our students in their health classes and discussed the dangers in the latest drug trends. The students were extremely interested and the officers

presented the information in a way that was educational, informative and comfortable enough to encourage students to ask questions.

The Live Smart Coalition, the Chelmsford Police, and the Chelmsford Health Department held a two evening presentations for parents and community members. The CHS Performing Art Center filled over 800 seats for their "Not My Child" presentation about drug use in our local community. This show of support between the school, community resources, and the parents was very impressive.

We recently had three of our faculty members recognized for their outstanding accomplishments. Margaret Blakley, an English teacher and our English Language Arts Program Facilitator, was recognized by Chelmsford Patch News as the Patch News "Teacher of the Year". She was selected because of her relationship with her students, her passion for teaching, her involvement as a student advisor, and as a teacher leader. Jack Fletcher was recently received the Chelmsford Rotary "Man of the Year" award. Jack was selected because of his life-long dedication to the Chelmsford High School Athletic Department and other

student programs. He has spent his life as an advocate for students and believes that every child who wants to participate in a sport has the opportunity to do so. Mr. Cyrus Comninos, one of our Emerson House Guidance Counselors, was recognized by MIT for his commitment, patience, dedication and determination to help his students through their four years of high school. David Couto, Class of 2010 and class valedictorian, nominated Mr. Comninos.

Once again, I can give you only some of the highlights of the accomplishments of our students and staff at Chelmsford High School. We continue to be successful in all areas of academics, extracurricular, sports and community projects. Our faculty, students, and parents are supportive and committed. I look forward to the spring when we will name "Mr. CHS", marvel at the musical, participate in the Chelmsford 24-Hour Relay Challenge, experience all the wonderful activities during senior week, and celebrate graduation day with the Class of 2011. CHS ALUMNUS PROFILE

JAMES SOUSA

Jim Sousa, retired Chelmsford Deputy Fire Chief, sits comfortably in his family room surrounded by pictures of his children, memorabilia, his books and professional journals. A police scanner occasionally chirps in the background, Penelope Barker, an abused cat that he rescued, meanders by, and the smell of chocolate wafts through the air as his wife, Eileen, makes caramel turtles and fudge for the holidays. A humble man, Jim would rather share stories of his daughters' achievements than to speak of his own thirty-seven year legacy of dedication and service to the Chelmsford Fire Department, to the people of the town of Chelmsford, and to the countless firemen whom he has trained. It soon becomes apparent that far more than firefighter, Jim Sousa is a fascinating multifaceted individual: avid reader, educator, lifelong learner, cat rescuer, problem-solver, storyteller, "genuine Volvo nut," antique motorcycle lover and much more.

A 1964 graduate of CHS, former Deputy Fire Chief Jim Sousa spent his high school years at what is now the McCarthy Middle School. He attended the Westlands School through grade six, and the East and McFarlin Schools for grades seven and eight, respectively. As he reflects back on his time at CHS, Jim recalls days spent in Marjorie Scoboria's math class where he gained his love of plane geometry. "She allowed for my imagination, letting me make up my own theorems and construct prototypes out of cardboard." A student in George Simonian's biology class, Jim remembers with amazement that "Mr. Simonian corrected and returned essay tests the very next day, and he even corrected the grammar." Jim remarks that Mr. Simonian's work ethic and high expectations set an example for his students. Jim credits his ability to think outside the box to his physics teacher, Mr. Connery, who encouraged him to be a free thinker. Iim shares that his Chelmsford education served him well wherever he went. After high school Jim spent a year at Lowell Tech, crediting that experience for instilling in him his "engineering thinking." "I also learned that you don't have to know everything, but you do need to know how or where to find the answers. Life is about a problem to be solved."

Drafted in 1966, Jim spent a year in electronics school in Fort Monmouth, NJ where he also taught for six months. He received orders to Brussels to SHAPE, Supreme



Headquarters Allied Power Europe, where it was his job to repair everything from the general's vacuum on up. While there, he ran a slot car track for the children of the military families and participated in such activities as tennis, high jump, soccer, and bowling during his time off. "It was the best assignment in the world," he comments.

When Jim returned home to Chelmsford, he began working for Microwave Associates in Burlington, MA where he worked on devices for airplane radar systems. During that time, Jim's friend, who was preparing to take the fireman's exam, coaxed him into practicing along with him. After a year of supporting his friend, Jim decided that he would take the exam along with him.

When he discovered that the fire department was paying \$10.00 more a week than Microwave, Jim joined the Chelmsford Fire Department where he "became a member of a big family of around fifty others." He relates, "In the army, I was in a secure area and in Microwave, I was in the middle of a big building, but in the fire department I dealt directly with people, got feedback to see what was working and what wasn't." This feedback provided Jim with many opportunities for personal and professional growth and "if it was something to do with his position, he made it his life work to become knowledgeable and expert on the subject," says former colleague, Bill Keohane, who trained under Sousa.

Keohane goes on to say that Sousa even went so far as to learn about international codes and to read and archive all of the journals having to do with his job, keeping abreast of all of the changes in fire safety and prevention. When asked about his greatest challenge as a fireman, Jim quickly responds, "Not challenges, but plenty of opportunities. I have had all of the jobs in the department at least twice: fire fighter, Captain, Fire Prevention Officer, and Deputy Chief three different times." At one point, Jim also served as interim chief. Those opportunities allowed him to explore and study such areas as the behavior of fire, the inspection of hazards, and the teaching of safety and fire prevention.

"The key to fire safety is teaching people to be safe," Sousa remarks as he recalls with sadness the Our Lady of the Angels School fire in Chicago in 1958 where ninety-two students and three nuns lost their lives. One nun, however, only lost one student in her class because she instructed the students to pile desks and other furniture up against the door giving them more time to escape out the window. "This gave rise to school fire drills by the end of the 1950's and new fire codes to protect public buildings."

For twenty-six years Jim served as the Deputy in Charge of Training. His efforts brought Chelmsford's Fire Prevention Office to the forefront. Bill Keohane, recalls that "firefighters from all over would call Jim with their questions" seeking his expert advice. Jim even worked towards promoting smoke detectors in Chelmsford early in his career and promoted the use of carbon monoxide detectors long before the law mandated them. "Jim was always thinking down the road," comments Deputy of Operations Mike Donoghue.

Donoghue, like Keohane, has nothing but accolades as he reflects on his years of working with Jim Sousa. "I learned something everyday from Jimmy, about the job and about how to treat people. Jim teaches by doing; he encourages you to explore and find your own way but instinctively knows when you need assistance. Jimmy is a teacher at heart." Mike also learned from Jim's sandwich theory, which perhaps came from an Interpersonal Relations class that Jim once attended. When Jim was inspecting a building for fire hazards, he

would first point out what the person was doing right, then he would point out what needed to be corrected and upon leaving he would tell the person what a nice job he was doing. Jim always put people at ease, which helped him to get the job done.

After attending the Massachusetts Fire Academy in Stow, Sousa began teaching and in a fifteen-year period taught virtually every class from recruiting classes to advanced classes, bringing training to eighty or ninety different fire departments. Jim's affinity for teaching came from the great programs he was involved in, in the army. "During the twenty-six years that Jim held the position of Deputy in charge of all training, he provided fire fighters with similar if not superior training to



that of the Fire Academy," remarks Keohane.

Undoubtedly prompted by his "teaching by doing" philosophy, Jim recalls participating in the Fire Fighter Challenge where, in full turn out gear, he competed in a firefighters' performance trial test on a job-related course, which consisted of such feats as climbing five flights of stairs, pulling a hose up five flights, and dragging an adult sized dummy to name a few, all in record time. He won in his group coming in under five minutes.

Ultimately, Sousa left teaching in order to be trained for the state Hazmat team and was appointed one of the members of the state's first team, of which there are now six in the state. During his time on the team, he participated in one eight hour day of training a month. "The fire department provided me with many opportunities to learn new things, and I always enjoyed learning." Sousa remembers one Hazmat call to a truck terminal in Reading, MA where a forklift operator had run over a box containing a powder-like substance. It turned out that the substance was a vaporizing insecticide which could have killed the operator had Jim's team not been called. Sousa also served as a member of the Chelmsford Emergency Planning Team.

When asked about his greatest accomplishment Jim responds, "Getting married, staying married and having our two daughters." Jim endearingly characterizes his wife of thirty-eight years, Eileen Grunewald ('67) as "a wonderful,

patient, capable individual who can do almost anything." Eileen retired six years ago from her job as the Merrimack Valley Special Education Collaborative Secretary in the Alternative High School. Jim beams with pride as he chats about his two daughters. Christine Sousa-Herwig ('94) graduated from UMass Amherst and later received her masters from Cornell. A wildlife biologist, Christine has traveled extensively to study mute swans about which she has published several papers. Christine is currently studying ring-neck ducks in Minnesota. His other daughter, mother of his three-year-old grandson Kyle, Sharon Pelletier ('97) studied Equine Science and Entrepreneurship at UMass Amherst. She currently resides in Coventry, CT where she works as a veterinary technician.

Now that he is retired, Jim may be found enjoying the vintage car collection at the Larz Anderson Auto Museum in Brookline, MA, working on "project hulk", a car that he hopes to fix up as a race car, riding around in his 1964 Volvo PV 544 with its red fenders and taxi cab motif, tinkering with one of his antique motorcycles, or visiting his many friends at the firehouse. And of course, he will enjoy spending more time with his wife, daughters and grandson.

The smell of chocolate still wafting through the room, Jim proudly shares pictures of his family and of his antique car, while Eileen shares her fabulous caramel turtles. As Penelope Barker brushes against his leg, Jim scoops his beloved cat up into his arms, and ever the "teacher at heart," relates the interesting story of the historical significance of her name. In the background, the faint sounds from his scanner keep him connected to his thirty-seven year past with the Chelmsford Fire Department.

Happy New Year! We have had rain, snow, winds, even reindeer... and through it all, the CPS Fine Arts Students and their Teachers demonstrate the strength of our programs here in Chelmsford!

The CHS Marching Band was red-hot throughout football season; Chelmsford Friends of Music, alongside Band Director Matt Sexauer, organized the annual MICCA music preview show that was held on the CHS fields this year, hosting several other high school and college level bands who joined Chelmsford to play their schools' greatest hits.

The CHS Band also acted as ambassadors to their younger musical counterparts. On Friday, November 5th, the largest marching band ever assembled at Chelmsford High School performed at the Simonian Stadium. The performance was the centerpiece of the town's first ever "Band Night", hosted by the CHS Band. The event featured 6th, 7th, and 8th grade band students from the McCarthy and Parker Middle Schools performing as special guests with the CHS Marching Band at the weekend's home football game halftime.

The musical choices were a big hit with students and fans in the stands alike; after the CHS Marching Band performed their popular Queen Medley, the 6th-8th grade students joined them on the field to play well-liked hits by such artists as Journey, Aerosmith, and Lady Gaga.



They received a standing ovation from an excited crowd. Director Mr. Sexauer plans to make this an annual event.

Everyone who attended the annual CHS Winter Concert last month can attest to the talent and drive of our young musicians. The Honors Orchestra, Jazz Ensemble, Treble Choir, Jazz Choir, Concert Band, Orchestra, and Concert Choir each performed music from a variety of genres of music. Kate Comeau, who is new to CHS this year after working for several years at other Chelmsford schools, conducted her first high school ensembles to an enthusiastic audience. As always, the night wrapped up with alumni joining current students onstage to perform the Hallelujah Chorus from Handel's Messiah.

Our musicians are go-getters outside

of school programs as well; on a chilly Saturday in November, over 1100 music students from public and private schools across the Northeastern part of Massachusetts auditioned for the 2010-2011 Northeast Senior District Music Ensembles. Out of this group, 450 students from grades nine through twelve were selected to participate in this prestigious Massachusetts Music Educators Association event. The program is offered by the MMEA as an enrichment opportunity providing a musical experience to talented young people.

This year, I am proud to announce that 21 students from Chelmsford were selected for the Senior District Concert Band, Orchestra, Chorus, and Jazz Ensembles. The students will rehearse with guest conductors and then perform in a concert to be

held at Lowell High School in Lowell, MA on Saturday, January 8, 2011.

In addition to having 21 students accepted, students who receive a score in the top 50% of their area are eligible to audition for the MMEA All-State Ensembles. These auditions took place at the end of January. Those students selected for the All-State Ensembles will perform at Symphony Hall in Boston at the end of March. Chelmsford is fortunate to have 8 out of the 21 Senior District students be recommended for the All-State Auditions.

This year's art students also have some special opportunities to share their excellent work.

The Art Teachers are currently entering many individual student works into the annual Boston Globe Scholastic Art & Writing Award Competition. Students involved will be awarded Gold Keys, Silver Keys, and Honorable Mentions by an experienced jury panel; Gold and Silver Award winning submissions will be exhibited at the Massachusetts State Transportation Building in Boston. In addition, Gold Key works will travel to New York City in digital form for national review. The award ceremony will be held in Boston in February.

In addition, Student work will be exhibited throughout the month of March in the Chelmsford Starbucks and at the Chelmsford Public Library to participate in "Arts in Our Schools Month." These K-12 exhibits will allow exhibit-goers to see first hand the amazing progress that the art students make through the CPS curriculum.

Last but definitely not least, our Theater Guild celebrated excellent run of their fall play, Arsenic and Old Lace. Their fund-raising show, Head of the Class, incorporating alumni as well as current students and faculty, was the talk of the halls earlier in the season. Theater Guild members are currently preparing for their original play, Are you For Cereal, and this year's musical, Miss Saigon, promises to be yet another hit directed by Mr. Rondina and Mrs. Cochran. (Editor's note: This trip down "memory lane" was submitted by your classmate Russell Mann, enjoy!)

My family moved into our Littleton Road home in 1954. Chelmsford exuded small-town charm, and the 50's and 60's were a great time to grow up here. When I see what has become of the little town I once loved, I long for those old days.

My Boy Scout Troop, troop 66, met at the Unitarian Church. Our Scoutmaster, Bob Clough (class of '31), was a genuinely nice guy.

My brother, Steve ('67), and other kids around our age loved to ring the bell at Central Baptist Church on Sunday mornings. As they clung to the thick rope with a death grip, the weight of the bell would lift them several feet off the floor.

A number of us played baseball in the small triangular park at Westford and Worthen Streets across from the Congregational Church.

St. Mary's Church resembled a Spanish mission. With its yellow adobe exterior, it seemed more suited to California. Farther down on Fletcher Street, my parents would buy our Christmas trees from the Greenwood's, where Lowell Five Cent Savings Bank is now. The father of Lenny Olenchak ('64) made delicious donuts in his shop approximately where Chelmsford Auto School is.

Sometimes we would walk onto Emerson's Farm and look for Ernie, the farmhand. He would always appear wearing his muddy rubber boots and warning us not to scare his hogs.

I attended the Center, the Quessy, the East, the McFarlin, and the old high school. Among the many teachers I had who conveyed passion for their subject were Mr. Tournas, Mrs. Mooney, Mrs. Poland, Mr. Boucher, Mr. Sargent, Mr. Simonian, and Mr. Rancatore, who cautioned us to "never put anything smaller than your elbow in your ear." Some of us boys were bussed from grade school

to the old YMCA in Lowell for swimming lessons. School cancellations due to severe weather were signaled by several powerful blasts from air horns atop the town hall.

Bob Germann (Keith Academy '64) and I picked up our Lowell Sun newspapers at the old town hall. There was a Coke machine inside and "Germ" and I always fished for coins in the change slot. My route consisted of Chelmsford center and Littleton Road. The weekly paper was 42 cents. If you bought the Sunday paper, it shot up to 62 cents. Some of my customers also employed me to mow their lawn, rake their leaves, and shovel their driveway.

When they went on vacation, I would do Bob's paper route, comprising part of Chelmsford Street and all of Bridge Street, and Donnie Wilcox's ('64) encompassing Westford and Worthen Streets.

Heavy traffic was basically nonexistent. You could hop in your car and drive unencumbered without stopping for traffic lights every hundred yards, and most people actually paid attention to the act of driving itself. I vividly recall trudging down the middle of Littleton Road alone in the predawn darkness during a snowstorm while delivering the Sunday Sun. The only sound was that of the snow crunching under my feet.

Before beginning my route, I would buy several candy bars at Page's Drug Store. Or I would cave in for one or two fresh-baked cinnamon rolls from Ruby Emery's Old Mill Bakery.

The old wood floors in Henry Eriksen's General Store creaked when you walked on them. Although the Atomic Fireballs™ there were mild by today's standards, we showed our bravado by sucking on them while awaiting the spicy blast. When

I moved back to town after six years in Southern California, I saw Henry sitting on the steps in front of Michael Sargent's dental practice on Chelmsford Street. While he and I reminisced over bottles of $Moxie^{TM}$, I confessed to several acts of pilfering penny candy. Ol' Henry shrugged it off and said I probably wasn't alone in my actions.

Around the corner from Eriksen's was Chelmsford Paint and Hardware, owned and operated by cigarchomping Harry Wilson. Cliff Kellogg manned another hardware store in the center near Godin's Five and Dime. Across the street was the original Harrington's Liquor Store. The present store, owned by John Harrington ('64), is an overwhelming success. His model train Christmas display is spectacular. Other businesses were the Three Barbers, the cobbler's, Jack's Diner, Ernie (Tetreault) the Barber, Eddie Hart's Clothing Store. Personal service abounded. Walter Lewis delivered his fresh Sunny Meadows Farm milk to us in bottles.

Bill and Andy's was a place I would go for red and white fishing bobbers and RevellTM and MonogramTM model car and plane kits. Cole's Store had awesome archery equipment.

Before it became Hallissey Chevrolet, my parents bought their beautiful two-tone blue 1957 Chevy Bel Air at Roger Boyd's. Chelmsford High classmate Tom Moriarty ('65) had another cool ride—a mint black 1940 Ford coupe, which he would sometimes drive to school.

Whenever my parents needed car repairs, they would go to where Artie Greenwood was service manager and Gordon Marshall was the chief mechanic at the Alpine Gulf Station next to Skip's Restaurant. When you pulled into any gas

station, the attendant gassed up your car, washed the windshield, and checked the oil.

Before Stop and Shop[™], there was Purity Supermarket where you could see a smiling Flo Redican operating a cash register. Jimmy Gagnon, one of my neighbors, retired from Purity as a butcher.

The Bowl-a-rama had duckpins and pool tables. Sometimes there were dances downstairs featuring the sound of Brent & the Spectres. The Alpine Lanes had ten pin bowling and the expertise of Cliff Keck and the Marcangelo father and son team.

North Chelmsford had Ballos Diner, the Paramount, Tony and Ann's Pizza, and Charlie Dinnigan's Lanes, which fed the duckpin bowling desire of those living in the capital and vicinity.

Johnny DePalma ('56) is credited with saving Dinnigan's, now called North Chelmsford Lanes. A likable guy and a class act, Johnny has owned and operated this piece of nostalgia since 1974. Walking down the stairs and into his lanes is like taking a trip back in history. When you ask him about the lanes, his face lights up and he regales you with stories about the history of his beloved business.

Another lasting business is Lupien's Farm. I'm following the tradition my mother started by buying apples and other goodies from Al ('54) and Maria's. On a crisp morning, Maria's sugar-frosted yeast bread, warmed up, slathered with butter, and accompanied with a cup of hot coffee, is sheer ecstasy.

My parents carted my brother and me off to the Chelmsford Drive-In where we saw movies such as The Ten Commandments and Some Like It Hot. We kids loved to climb the stairs to the top of Robin Hill Tower and witness the awesome panoramic view of the town. Long before the Freeman Bike Trail—a tribute to an outstanding human being, Bruce Freeman, and one of the few things the town has done right—we used to amble down the railroad tracks across the street from our house. The soothing sound of the freight train drifted into our open windows on summer nights.

In high school my friend, Bob "Mickey" Maguire ('64), was a soda jerk and I washed dishes at Howard Johnson's. Next to "Ho Jo's" was Strick's Market.

I also worked at Demoulas Supermarket where I printed the "More for Your Dollar" signs advertising the weekly specials. Prior to Demoulas's, A&P Supermarket stood where what remains of the Chelmsford Cinema.

We respected and feared the police. As a teenager, a menacing glare from Buddy Adams or Basil Larkin would leave me shaking in my loafers.

My cousins, the Colton's, lived on Concord Road, across the street from a beautiful pine forest that was bulldozed to create Chelmsford Farms I.

The family of Jim Flanagan ('66) leased the former "Bird Pony Farm" at the intersection of Golden Cove Road and Billerica Road for years after Bird moved the ponies to Dunstable. The barn is still there but the 18 acres of pasture were developed for housing.

Pine forests, woodlands, and open meadows have all but disappeared. Before it was widened, Littleton Road was lined with maple, elm, and oak trees, and an occasional chestnut tree. We are left with memories of Chelmsford Ginger Ale Company, Skip's Restaurant, and Skip's Ice Cream Stand. Now a parcel of Emerson Farm's land that was to be preserved for perpetuity is being replaced by some nondescript building.

The opening scene from the movie Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid shows Butch (Paul Newman) studying the exterior of a once familiar bank. He walks in and notices the bank now has new security measures. He says to the bank guard, "What happened to the old bank? It was beautiful." The guard replies, "People kept robbing it." Cassidy responds, "Small price to pay for beauty." ~ Russ
