



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE * Terry McSheehy


Hello everyone. I hope you all had a wonderful summer.

After I had been announced as the next Chelmsford High School Principal last spring, I came to meet the faculty during the last professional day of the year. It was really a terrific day - Anne O'Bryant graciously introduced me to the faculty, provided me with my first piece of CHS regalia (an official 'Lions' tie), and gave me the chance to have lunch with the faculty and to circulate through their professional development groups. The afternoon was relaxed and casual, and ultimately helped me to shape my entry plan as the principal from the high school where I graduated years before ('90).

A flood of memories came rushing back as I walked from the front parking lot down the walkway to the main entrance. When I entered the main office, I was greeted with a, "You haven't changed a bit...well maybe a little bit more gray than you were back then." Catching me completely by surprise I stumbled through a greeting. "Ummm, Hi...uh... Mr. Simonian." And there he was, George Simonian, the architect of Chelmsford High, the first Principal of the new CHS, and my Principal. We exchanged pleasantries that afternoon, and agreed to meet over the summer to talk about all things Chelmsford High. I had my checkbook ready for the meeting, knowing that George would talk to me about the CHS Alumni

Association. I was amazed by his commitment to the organization and the level of support the organization provides to our school and our students. As a result, I couldn't help myself from getting swept up by his passion. I blindly and eagerly said, "yes" to whatever he needed, and here I am writing my introductory piece for my first issue of Lion's Pride.

As a graduate of CHS and former resident of Chelmsford, I have deep respect and appreciation for Chelmsford High School. The teachers and students at CHS largely shaped my ideas of secondary education and inspired me to pursue a career in education. Since graduating from Chelmsford High, I have always looked back fondly on the sense of community that existed here and have spent my educational career trying to find it. There are lots of great memories I have of my youth in Chelmsford. My story was a little different than most CHS graduates; I was a "blow-in" moving here from Tewksbury in March of my 6th grade year. It was hard – I left my friends, my school, my sports teams, my neighborhood...everything. What I couldn't believe, and still can't believe, was how members of this town took me under their wing and made me feel as though I had always been here.

What I remember most about Chelmsford was the notion of 'Chelmsford Pride.' There was this tremendous sense of community, where people looked out for one another, supported one another, and worked hard together to improve. For me, Chelmsford High School represents the focal point of the at-large Chelmsford community, and it is a tremendous honor and a privilege to be able to come full circle and contribute some of my own ideas and experiences to support CHS in fulfilling it's mission. In future issues, I'll use this opportunity to reach out to all of you in the Alumni Association and share some stories and some of our achievements at the high school. 歳

CHS ALUMNI PROFILE By Kris Pisarik '77

FOR NEW CHS PRINCIPAL CHARLES CALIRI, A NEW BEGINNING AND A HOMECOMING

Charles Caliri looks pretty relaxed in his shorts, polo shirt and sneakers as he entertains a visitor in his cramped office at Chelmsford High exactly one week before the start of the new school year, his first at the helm of CHS or anywhere else for that matter.

"More nervous or excited" for opening day, he's asked.

"It's time to pull that Band-Aid off," he says, adding that he has worked all summer getting to know the school, the system, the teachers — to that point 40 of them had taken him up on his offer to sit down and talk and get acquainted.

Caliri says he learned a lot over the summer and that CHS has a great support staff of which he's been asking lots of question. "They've provided me with a great deal of information, and that prompts more questions about what should stay and what should change. All that has been great feedback.

"But I'm missing the noises of the school, the kids in the hall, the opening doors," he adds.

Caliri, 39, a 1990 CHS grad, has spent his share of time in school halls. He comes to CHS after a five-year stint as dean at Lexington High. Before that he was director of Math, Science and Technology for grades 6-12 in Hopkinton.

His career as an educator officially began as a science teacher in Revere 1995, but perhaps it began long before that. The son of two teachers – his mother taught in Billerica, his father in Somerville -- Caliri says he grew up being taught, "you're not going to be a teacher," since education in the post-Proposition 2 ½ era was not always an easy way to earn a living. "I spent the better part of my life running from my future," he laughs.

Since he was a science buff, Caliri majored in biology in the pre-med program at Boston College, but when he didn't get accepted into medical school, Caliri took a job working in a lab. After a couple of years, his father, having had a change of heart about a career in education after the approval of the Education Reform Act in 1993, prodded his son to get his teacher's license.

So he did.

He applied in Revere for what he called a "high risk, high gain" position, teaching both the highest and lowestachieving students. "I got to work in a classroom and felt really comfortable." (He also coached some basketball and volleyball in Revere.)

He's never looked back.

By most Townie standards, Caliri, now a Holden resident, where he lives with his wife, Sarah, and children Matthew, 6, Michael, 4, and Emma, 2, would have been considered a "blow-in" when his family moved to Chelmsford for sixth grade to avoid the double sessions he was about to experience in Tewksbury where they were living at the time.

"It was hard (uprooting and leaving friends), but this town embraced me. I made friends," he recalls.

A National Honor Society member and JV basketball player at CHS, Caliri says he wishes he had participated in more extracurricular activities, but worked a lot of hours at Somerville Lumber in Acton.

But what he might have lacked in extras he made up for in the classroom, thanks to the likes of then-English teacher (and present Emerson House Dean) Jeff Doherty, who he still calls a "charismatic guy," and math teacher Rebecca Nordengren, who "pushed me and was a driving force" for him in AP calculus.

Caliri says his CHS foundation, with its house system and structure, is what he thinks high schools should be. "There's a whole sense of character and community that I haven't seen in other places."

When news spread last year that CHS Principal Anne O'Bryant would be retiring, Caliri says, "I said, 'I've got to give this a shot.""

"I was happy in Lexington," he says, acknowledging he was also a finalist for the position at Nashoba Regional in Bolton and in Hudson, in an effort to be closer to Holden.

"I chose to come home," he stresses.

Now that he's here, Caliri knows there is work to be done. Helping a high school move forward in an ever-changing digital age will be one challenge, he says. And at this writing, the finishing touches were being put on the draft of the school's re-accreditation report, which will highlight its strengths and weaknesses.

He smiles again; perhaps knowing he's inheriting a school that is likely to have many more checks in the "plus" column.

Stealing a quick glance over the stacks of paper and folders that have enveloped his office, he says, "At times it's a little overwhelming, but the kids are going to come and learn. And I know my way around, and teachers and staff all make it easier.

"There's something about this town that makes you want to come back," Caliri says. "There's a great sense of community and pride."

Since 1993 - a total 0f \$ 520,000 in 1015 scholarships to CHS seniors and alumni and \$ 3,700 to 16 Wilmington High School seniors.

A special thanks to the scholarship committee chaired by **Joan Murphy** and **Carol Pilat** for their efforts in determining the scholarship recipients.

And a special thanks to the awards night committee chaired by **Nancy Hughes** for all of their efforts in making that evening such a success. Next awards night will be held Thursday, 9 May 2013 in the Performing Arts Center.

Fourth of July - 2012

High school initiatives this past year we added two students as non-voting members to the board of directors.

The objectives behind this action was to increase our knowledge of high school activities from the students' perspective and for the students to become more aware of what an alumni association is all about. Just prior to graduation, the association provided all the watermelon that the seniors could eat at their senior week picnic. Thanks to **Jessica Del Llano** for her leadership in this effort. Our hope is to build on this success with similar activities this coming year.





From your class agent, Jack Costello: "This article is being sent early to the Lion's Pride as I will be on vacation in Las Vegas. Judy and I have been going there for close to twenty years and have been in most of the hotels but not always as guests.

Many of the old hotels, including say the Mirage, have rooms that would be small compared to the newer hotels. We now have been staying at the Palazzo Hotel which is a newer building to the Venetian. The difference between them is one has the canals and many shops and restaurants making it more like a shopping mall. The Palazzo has very few restaurants and shops. Both have larger rooms than the older hotels like the Mirage. The ones we have used are about 47 feet long and 20 feet wide, with a ten by ten bathroom.

This trip we are trying something different by avoiding the sometime crowd of people checking in and out by taking advantage of a special area on the 23rd floor that has both check-in and out as well as a lounge with breakfast and some kind of brunch in the afternoon. The price of the room covers all the amenities usually charged separately on the other floors.

Our committee includes Nancy (Wilder) Dziczek (who right now can't afford to spend a lot of time with us because of family sickness), but Dick and Binki Wright and my wife, Ruth, and I have picked up the slack and we will move ahead smoothly and have a memorable reunion. We review everything we do with Nancy, though, because of

the breadth of experience with our class that she brings to the group. We're working hard and think it will show in the product we deliver on October 6, 2013.

CLASSMATE SNAPSHOTS:

The two we introduce this month are interesting contrasts: the first, Franklin Warren, represents a person who stayed in Chelmsford on property that had been in his family since 1699. The other is one of our most active and popular classmates, Ellie (Gray) Gatenby, who followed her husband of 55 years in his corporate life, finally landing and settling for good in the state of Virginia. Ellie chose to introduce us to her life through a letter to her CHS 1953 classmates - I include it here as submitted.

CLASSMATE SNAPSHOT: FRANKLIN WARREN This Class A cent's lasting memo

This Class Agent's lasting memory of Franklin Warren was the time, in one of the Warren's farm outer buildings, Franklin, John Buzzell and I (maybe others, too, but I forget) were decorating the bed of the Warren's 1952 Ford Truck that became our float in a Chelmsford Booster Club's parade. Needless to say that it was well into the night before we finished. And, do you remember that Irene Oczowski was Queen of our float?

I asked Franklin the significance of his middle name --Emerson -- and found out that it was a family name and that he and his sister, Martha ('50) can trace their family lineage back to the brother of Ralph Waldo Emerson, who lived in Concord.

The Warren farm today runs from Boston Road all the way to Acton

Road -- a total of 56 acres. Originally when it was established as a farm by Dr. Joseph Warren in 1699 (the acreage totaled 200 acres (it was a wedding present for him and his wife.) The Warren Farm was a fully operational farm when we were in high school, with about 20 milkproducing cows, 2000 leghorn chickens, pigs and a team of horses. Today the farm produces only hay which is baled and sold. Franklin lives at 77 Boston Road, in the same house where he grew up, and his sister, Martha, lives at 91Boston Road in a house built in 1889. Both these homes have always been in the Warren Family, and have never been sold.

Franklin married the girl down the street - Mary Lewis - (CHS Class of 1956). They have been married for 53 years and have four children --2 boys and 2 girls-- and are now grandparents of Abigail Sarah and Emily Rachel. When Franklin graduated CHS he immediately began working full time on his dad's farm. Franklin's dad, Edwin, was a farm product agent for Eastern States including cattle and chicken grains. On a trip to the Waltham Eastern States Office, Franklin was offered a job as a truck driver, delivering their products. The job paid \$1.10/hour - a heck of a lot more than his dad was paying himand Franklin jumped at it. 33 years later, he retired. During these years Franklin moved from truck driver into management positions with the company, running some of their offices including the one in South Chelmsford. He even temporarily moved himself and his family west for 3 years to manage their Westfield, MA office. Today Eastern States has been purchased and their products are sold under the Agway banner. In 1986 the Town of Chelmsford recruited Franklin for Animal Control Officer, and he filled that role until 2006, when, after 20 years

on the job, he retired (again).

For relaxation and time away from the farm, Franklin and Mary were members of the Covered Wagon Travel Trailer Club offering excursions five times a year. Fellow classmate, Fred Bovill (now deceased) and his wife were also members of this Club.

A few years ago the Warrens agreed to allow Chelmsford Minutemen to re-enact a colonial battle on their fields, welcoming the soldiers as well spectators. Franklin and Mary are true Yankees --rejecting technology in any form except for a telephone answering machine. However, if you were selecting a CHS couple to be close friends with, Franklin and Mary would, I am sure, be tops on your list. They are simply good people, good citizens, and good Americans.

CLASSMATE SNAPSHOT: ELEANOR (GRAY) GATENBY "Hello CHS Classmates, 1953! 


stood in for her more than I typically would have had to. She still had great hair. It was all about the hair.



1962-1963 CHS BOYS BASKETBALL TEAM

The 1962-63 Chelmsford High School basketball team dropped an early season decision to Concord, then roared through twenty-one games, without defeat, to finish with twenty-three wins and one loss. During the Christmas vacation, the team journeyed to Berlin, New Hampshire, where they soundly defeated two New Hampshire teams, Gorham and Berlin.

On February twelfth, the Lions decisioned a strong North Andover team to secure the Lowell Suburban League title for the fourth year in succession. The team concluded league play unbeaten, and now Chelmsford owns a string of thirty-four straight league wins.

Due to their fine record, the Lions gained a berth in the Tech Tourney. They easily defeated and putclassed St. Clements of Somerville squad 85-50 in the first round. The second round found them rolling over Newton's Sacred Heart 41-16 and so qualifying to play in Boston Garden. In the semifinals, the Lions whipped a strong Rockland team 70-46. The finals matched Chelmsford against the scrappy Plymouth Blue Eagles for the second year in a row. The Lions gained a 64-59 victory to capture the Eastern Massachusetts Class C Championship for the first time in twelve years.

The quality of Chelmsford ballplaying pointed out the excellent coaching of Mr. Henry P. McCarthy, who has done an outstanding job of teaching the boys basketball and sportsmanship.

All through the season, the Lions played outstanding ball and were acclaimed throughout the state. Led by the fabulous Hank Brown, they were one of the most formidable fives in the New England area. Brown, noted for his ability to "stuff" the ball, was hailed by many for both his tremendous defensive and offensive work. He was heralded as "Athlete of the Year" by the Lowell Sun and later was picked the "Athlete of the Week" by the Boston Herald for his Tech Tourney play.

Our congratulations to the coach and team for their double-championship year.



For two weeks this summer, a dozen Chelmsford middle and high school flute players spent time together as a section and honing their skills on their instruments. The second annual "Flute Ensemble Extravaganza" summer flute camp was held at Chelmsford High School, and gave students a unique opportunity to play music in a setting designed just for flute ensemble, or as they call it, "flute choir."

Ranging in grades from 5-12, the students were given a pile of brand new music, scale sheets, and sightreading exercises. They diligently worked together in two levels (one beginner ensemble, and one intermediate ensemble) to rehearse music as a small chamber ensemble. This type of playing is especially different from what they experience during the school year when they are always playing in a band setting with many other instruments and players creating sound around them. This gave them the chance to fine tune skills specific to the flute, such as how to produce a great sound, how to hold the instrument properly, how to breathe properly, and how their sounds can blend together to create a beautiful harmonious sound as a group.

Director Allison Lacasse, who founded the camp, says that this is one of her favorite two weeks of the year. A flutist herself, she is passionate about giving the children a chance to bond together as a little "flute family," and to spend some time with the students in a strictly flute-playing setting. Lacasse states that "Having a passion for your instrument is so important as a young musician, and this camp gives everyone involved a chance to improve, grow, learn, and have fun in a smaller learning environment." There are even two high school students who volunteered their time at the camp and had the opportunity to lend their advice and get some teaching experience in. "This is why music-making is so funthere are bonds being made among students who may not have even met each other if it were not for the camp," said Lacasse.

The students put on a casual concert for their families at the culmination of the camp. Both ensembles performed their own flute choir pieces and ended with a grand finale of "Flute Camp Canon," their own version of Pachelbel's "Canon in D Major."

Also this summer, CHS Student Elizabeth Sperry placed third in the National Flute Association high school competition in Las Vegas, Nevada. Elizabeth is currently a member of the CHS Band, the CHS Student-led Symphony Orchestra, and the CPS All-Town Band, and has volunteered her time working in the Chelmsford Community Education "Summer Flute Camp" for the past 2 years. She also performs in the award-winning pit band for CHS musical productions. Outside of Chelmsford, Elizabeth is a private student of Judy Grant, director of the Boston Flute Academy. Elizabeth has a long list of credits and accomplishments in her 6 short years of studying. At 11, she placed 3rd in the New England String competition. At 12, she won the NYO solo competition. Several times, she placed first in Junior and Senior Districts, as well as the Massachusetts Music Educator's Association All-State Festival. Elizabeth performed on "From The Top" last fall and recently toured Europe with the Boston Youth Orchestra. Elizabeth enjoys the opportunity to study with and receive Master classes from some of the finest flutists in the Nation.

When asked what Ms. Sperry would recommend to Chelmsford music students, she encourages them to "Surround yourselves with people that encourage you to improve your skills and who will help you to reach your maximum potential." Chelmsford is honored to have produced one of the finest high school flutists in our country, and a most wonderful role model for all of our Chelmsford music students. She is living proof that with diligence, good training, and perseverance, any student can reach their aspirations and dreams.

The attire of the evening ranged from stunning sun dresses and striking red suede heels to uniforms and running shoes sported by students who had rushed from their games just in time to accept their scholarships at the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association Fourteenth Annual Awards Night last May 14th in the Performing Arts Center. By the evening's end, 114 CHSAA scholarships had been awarded to deserving members of the Class of 2012, as well as to a number of alumni. This increases the total number of CHSAA scholarships that have been awarded to CHS graduates over the last twenty years to an amazing 1,015.

Since 1991 when \$350 scholarships were awarded to two seniors, the CHSAA has given out over half a million dollars in scholarships to CHS graduates. Today "the CHSAA endowment has grown to well above the one million dollar mark on its way to two million," shared proud association President and MC of the evening Terry McSheehy ('64). Executive Director George Simonian reminded the audience, that the endowment had come a long way since its inception in 1990 when George Parkhurst ('32) had donated \$1000 to begin the endowment concept. With excitement in his voice, McSheehy went on to say, "What a thrill this is for all of us tonight! The driving principle of the CHSAA is that the alumni of CHS give something back. Tonight is the finest example of that."

In Principal Anne O'Bryant's ('71) welcoming remarks, she praised the presenters and the benefactors for giving back and for supporting CHS students and graduates. She noted that many of the scholarships had been established in the names of beloved teachers, students, faculty, staff and community members. Their memories will live on forever as the CHSAA continues year after year to award scholarships in their names. To the recipients, she said, "I hope that you appreciate what your community has done for you, and I hope that you, too, will one day give back."

A lively and exceptionally spirited group of CHS students enthusiastically cheered and applauded as each of their fellow recipients walked across the stage to accept their scholarships.

An excited Elissa Ladwig proudly walked across the stage four times to receive the Leonora K. Battles Scholarship, the McGovern Family College Scholarship, the Fox Family Scholarship, presented to the president of the National Honor Society; and the John W. Kerins Memorial Scholarship, presented to a student who has demonstrated a love of the theater. "My graduation gift to myself was to be in the CHS musical, Jekyll and Hyde," shared Elissa. "I worked it out so that I could do tennis as well." When asked about being the recipient of four scholarships, Chelmsford High School's 2012 Student of the Year, CHS Scholar Athlete, and Tennis MVP responded, "I am very excited, honored and surprised." Elissa will be attending Tufts to study Biochemistry.

Matt Coughlan had a smile on his face as he accepted three different scholarships: the Robert F. Brown Family Scholarship, the Joseph P. 



The Chelmsford High School Alumni Association Scholarship Program

The Chelmsford High School Alumni Association Scholarship Program is part of an endowment fund that was established in 1990. At the 1990 annual meeting of the association, George Parkhurst of the class of 1932, suggested that the association establish an endowment fund as the start of a scholarship program. It was voted and George Parkhurst donated \$1000 to begin the endowment concept. A general fund raiser was conducted and the first monetary awards were given in the spring of 1991.

At the annual meeting of the alumni association in 1991, George Parkhurst proposed the concept of "special scholarships". These scholarships would be developed by donations from individuals, an organization, a business, or any other entity and would bear the name of the person or organization being recognized by the particular scholarship. Mr. Parkhurst also established the first "special scholarship" which bears his name today. These scholarships are now known as designated scholarships.

As of this issue, there are 98 of them with three more in the pipeline for next year. Any family, individual, or organization may establish a scholarship in recognition of a person, organization, or group by donating a minimum of \$5000 to the Chelmsford High School Alumni Association scholarship endowment fund. This donation becomes the principal or base amount of the individual scholarship fund. This scholarship fund may be added to at any time which then increases the principal or base. The annual amount of the scholarship award is derived from the annual accrued interest on the scholarship principal. To support these scholarships, the endowment fund continues to grow because of the generous contributions of graduating classes, alumni, parents, and friends of Chelmsford High School. The Alumni Association Scholarship Awards are given only to Chelmsford High School seniors and alumni.
