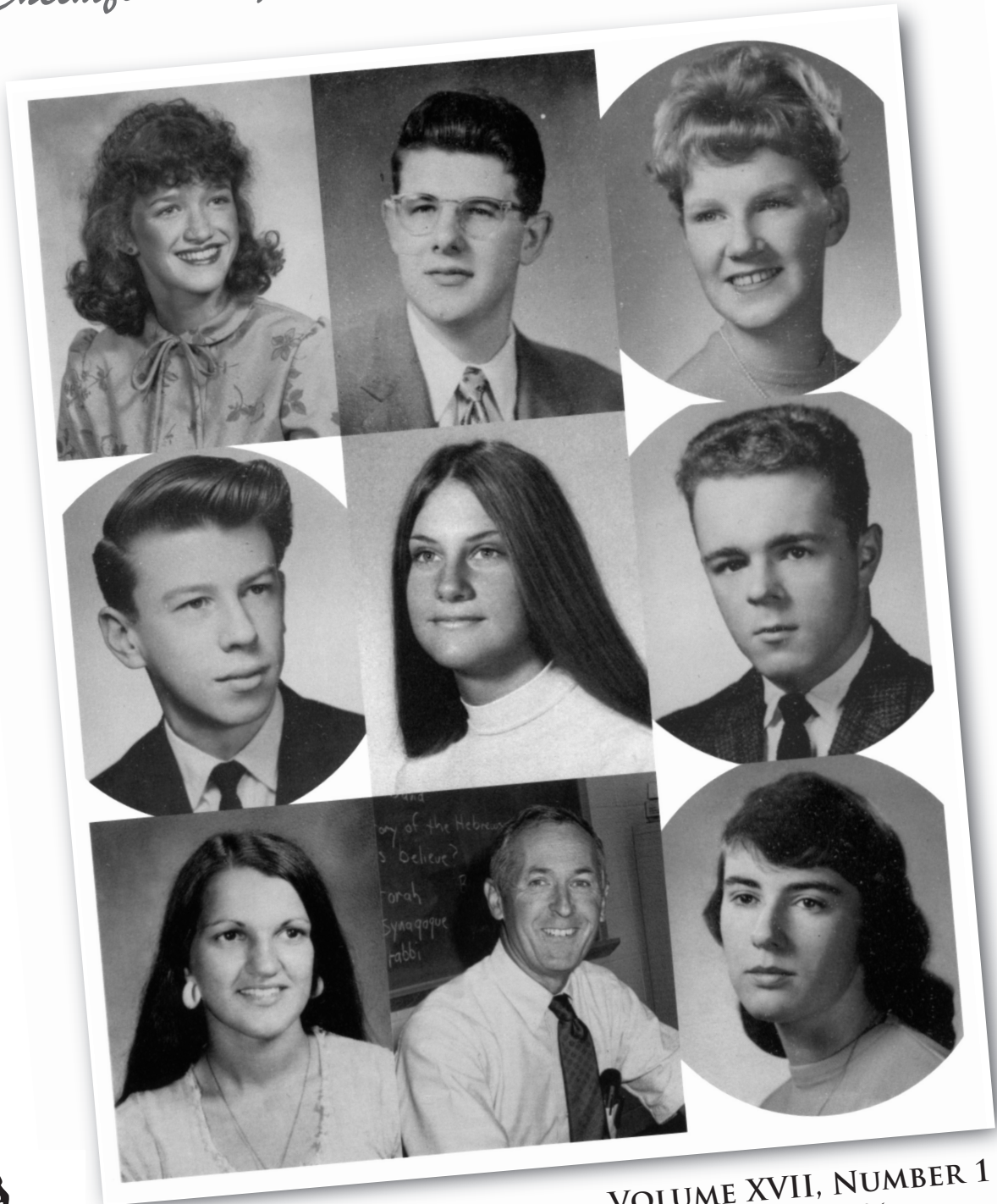

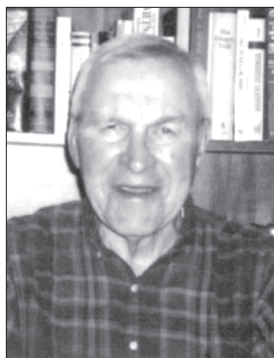

A TRIBUTE TO LUCY SIMONIAN

SHE WAS NOT EVEN A GRADUATE OF CHELMSFORD HIGH SCHOOL. SHE WAS, IN FACT, A GRADUATE OF LOWELL HIGH SCHOOL. HER ONLY OFFICIAL ROLE WAS AS COPY EDITOR OF THE LION'S PRIDE, THE ROBUST NEWSLETTER OF THE CHELMSFORD HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION. SHE KNEW NO EGO, BUT ONLY WORKED IN SERVICE TO OTHERS.

No volunteer worked harder and more effectively in behalf of CHS or its alumni association, than Lucy Simonian. When she died on November 26, 2005, she left a vacuum that could be more accurately described as a chasm.

She and her husband, George, past principal of CHS and now Executive Director of its alumni association, formed a team from which no dilemma was safe. In their hands insurmountable problems became mere challenges: mountains were reduced to molehills, and the impossible became a reality. Without this team, neither the association as it is now constituted, nor a more muted version would exist. In starkest terms, there would be no association at all.

Lucy was at her best as a proofreader of the *Lion's Pride*. Syntax or spelling or any other aversion to Warriner's Handbook was unsafe where Lucy was involved. When others among us might suggest overlooking minor flaws in the interest of time constraints, Lucy was insistent on exactness. She knew there were a thousand ways of doing things wrong, but only one way of doing things correctly.

Now we must face reality. No one can replace Lucy and what she accomplished. All of us must work harder and better. While we grieve her, and mourn we should and mourn we must, we would honor Lucy best by imitating her life. Work more in behalf of others, shelve egos, and never settle for second best. In this way, the wonderful spirit of Lucy Simonian will live on. ■

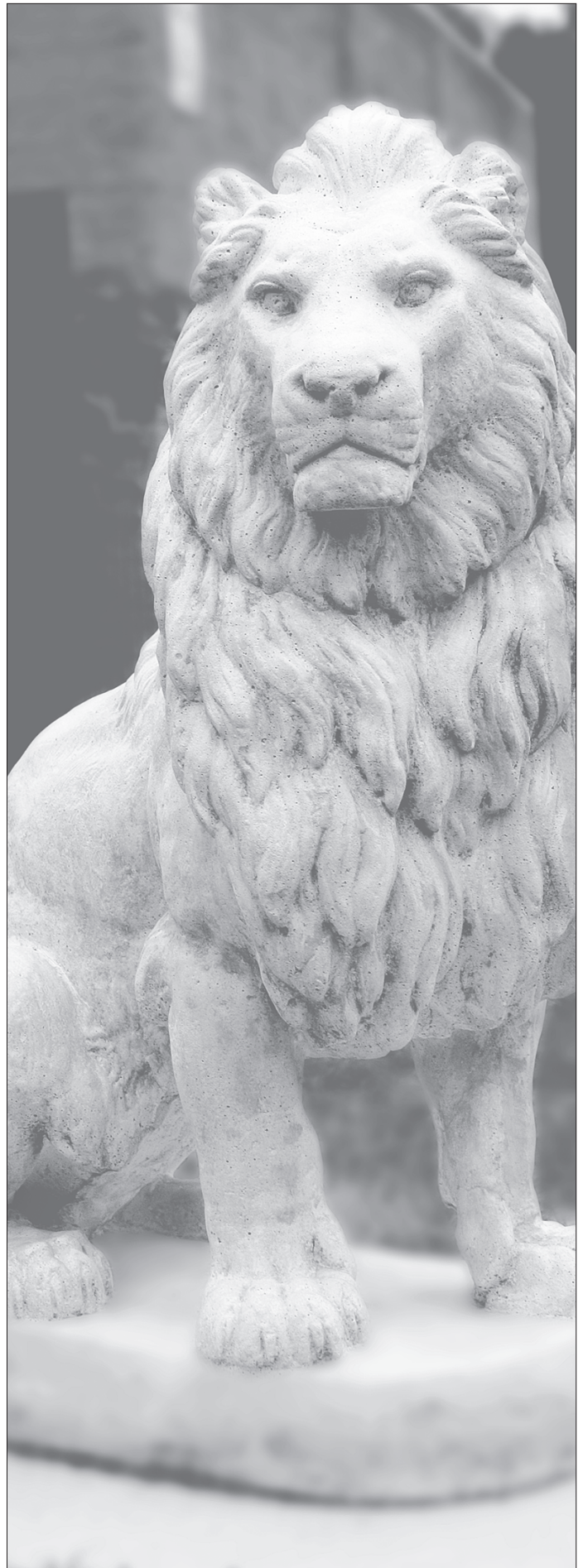

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE *Allen Thomas*

THE FIRST HALF OF THE SCHOOL YEAR IS COMING TO A CLOSE. SEMESTER EXAMS WILL RUN DURING THE LAST WEEK OF JANUARY. I AM PLEASED WITH THE MANY SUCCESSES THAT WE HAVE HAD, BUT THERE ARE ALWAYS CHALLENGES WITH WHICH TO DEAL.

Two major challenges are the building/renovation project and the projected budget shortfall for 2006-2007. The Central Administration has moved from the bottom level of the Emerson House wing at CHS to the old police station on North Road. I expect the construction area in the administration parking lot to be fenced within the next few days and for that part of the project to start. Four physics labs and two computer labs will be created in that wing.

The construction site for the new auditorium has been partially fenced. For now, the faculty can still park in that area, but by the end of the month, they will have to move into the next 200 spaces toward the stadium and around the corner toward Harrington School. When that happens, seniors will park out back in the remaining spaces and probably in the top and softball lots. It may be that there will not be room for junior parking for the rest of the year. Work on the auditorium is scheduled to start in February.

Four portable classrooms will soon be installed on the grass area next to the gym. They will house science classes and "On Your Own" classes as the administration wing and later the science wing are rebuilt. The transformer and wiring to support those units are almost ready.

We will have a beautiful new 1,000-seat auditorium and upgraded science facilities when the project is complete, but there will be a variety of challenges for students and staff during the construction period.

As many of you know, the school department has a projected shortfall of \$3 million for next year. The shortfall is due to increasing fixed costs (health care cost increases are very large), and inadequate state funding formula and limited local resources. Every possible source of revenue and every possible cost savings is being looked at. One proposal involved closing Westlands Elementary School and that immediately stirred great community interest. A sad reality

is that a large cut in school funding has to involve staff and/or facilities, because those two areas impact the budget the most.

All plans currently being discussed call for the elimination of 5.4 teachers at CHS. With a stable enrollment, it will be difficult to cut sections. However, we will try to make cuts in areas where teachers will be retiring or leaving and where the academic impact will be minimal.

"LIME (Leadership In Motion Everywhere)," has decided to revive the 24-Hour Relay in May. They have established a number of committees that have been hard at work under the direction of advisors Mr. Matt Barton and Ms. Linda Jowett.

Dean Anne O'Bryant is lending her experience, gained through running the event in the past, to the group. CHS is receiving a \$2,000 gift from the proceeds of the last event.

The junior/senior elective health course called "Reality Check" recently raised over \$4,000 for the Shiner's Burn Center in Boston. The classes went to the facility to learn of their work and to present the check with their teachers Ms. Maura Devaney and Mr. Matt Dibble.

The Red Cross Club, Student Council, Cheerleaders and Boys Cross Country Team combined efforts to

raise over \$1500 for relief to victims of hurricane Katrina.

CHS is almost always involved in one act of community service or another. Six hundred dollars was raised for the Secret Santa Fund by an auction at the faculty holiday luncheon. The money is used to buy gifts for older youngsters who are often forgotten when toys are purchased for the less fortunate.

The winter holiday semi-formal was a big hit once again. Over 900 well-behaved and well-dressed students attended the event. While a number of area high schools have stopped having events of this type, I remain convinced that events such as this are part of the total learning experience. Significant staff support is necessary for things to go well and our staff remains willing to provide it.

CHS STUDENT PROFILE

DAN LINDQUIST

STUDENT COUNCIL PRESIDENT DAN LINDQUIST IS BULLISH ON CHELMSFORD HIGH SCHOOL. THE ONE-MAN PUBLIC RELATIONS MAN EXUDES THAT "THERE IS SOMETHING HERE FOR EVERYONE." BEST OF ALL, HE EMBODIES WHAT HE PREACHES.

Dan's advice for those new to CHS is "get involved in a variety of activities. Don't merely go to classes." As if to illustrate what he professes, Lindquist participates in a seemingly endless number of activities himself. In addition to his role as president of the Student Council, Dan is involved in a host of additional groups. They include the yearbook, LIME (a leadership activity), class representative, the School Improvement Council, and the State Student Advisory Council. A four o'clock exodus from the school is a rarity, and there is no mystery as to why.

Dan describes the role of the Student Council to be one of community service. It manages the various elections in the school. It is involved with community needs. Perhaps the yearly highlight is the fabled "Spirit Week," held before the Thanksgiving Day football game, in

which competition among classes results in almost total student participation.

Having had a host of teachers, Dan is unhesitating as to the attributes of good teachers. They are "enthusiastic and love their subject." He cites Mr. Sherwood, his chemistry teacher, as a prime example. "He thoroughly enjoyed the experiments we did." His favorite courses have been chemistry and calculus. In both instances, the teachers were "passionate" about their subjects.

A perennial honor student, Dan's college applications are understandably ambitious. The list is varied and far-reaching. In addition to Harvard, he has applied at Tufts, Washington University in St. Louis, George Washington University, and Northeastern.

Asked for his opinions on a variety of issues and personalities, Dan willingly

responds. The Iraq War leaves him in a quandary. "I'm on the edge about it," he explains. Vice President Cheney is the subject of much "disagreement." The Red Sox are the "best team," and the student body would concur. Much can be learned from television, but one must be engaged actively, rather than passively. According to Dan, the biggest problem facing people of his age today is how they are perceived from the outset. Too many adults brandish all youth as "all doing drugs" and as "all bad." Such stereotypes come from unthinking adults who seek easy answers to complex issues. They are the product of ignorance devoid of thinking. They are to be condemned.

The biggest problem facing the country today may be that people have difficulty in making up their own minds. They are too easily convinced by television snippets, rather than by extending themselves through intensive, serious reading. They avoid serious thought and succumb to ideas that cannot withstand rational analysis.

Asked who in the entire range of American History he admires, Dan settles on Abraham Lincoln. It was he who fought for what he believed in the face of insults, it was he who formed a cabinet of his enemies, and it was he with the vision to "bind up the nation's wounds" so that what the Founding Fathers had created might be preserved.

Dan is no less engaged during the summer months. He manages an ice cream emporium at Lake Winnetoesauke. Far from classrooms and laboratories, he nevertheless is involved.

Dan Lindquist is bright, positive in his thinking, confident in his abilities, and seems to be preparing himself for a life worth living. He puts the lie to the simple-minded thinking of those who would castigate the young. He works in the school to make life better for all. Tomorrow he will work for the larger society. ■

SANDRA “SANDIE” TAYLOR

Sandie's affiliation with the Chelmsford Public Schools is ongoing from her childhood. “I attended the Center School, East, Quessy, McFarlin, and McCarthy,” she says, commenting that many people today would probably not recognize the names of many of those schools. Her education truly prepared her for life ahead, primarily in her field of English education. Sandie credits many of her teachers as influences, but particularly Martha Kineen, whom she had for two years and who was instrumental in instructing her on how to write.

While a student at CHS, Sandie knew she wanted to pursue a career in education, and was a member of the Future Teachers of English organization. After student teaching in an open classroom setting in Hollis, New Hampshire, it was Ed Quinn whom encouraged Sandie to apply for a position back in her hometown. Thirty-two years later, she says she is thankful that Ed took that step to encourage her in this direction.

Throughout the years, Sandie has seen many changes throughout the school. Her graduating class of 1969 was the last to see an enforced dress code. She believes that today more attention should be given to students' attire. “Behavior can be connected to how people are dressed,” she states, adding that today's students seem to see no distinction between beach attire and school attire.



However, she does believe that the media's influences are to blame for the current fashion trends. Students are merely imitating what they see on television, in magazines, and in the music industry.

The addition of a new auditorium at the high school is a positive change of which Sandie is very excited. “This will be huge for the kids in theatre and music,” she says with a very wide smile, and also adds the benefit of “the ability to have the entire school be present in an auditorium at once will be fantastic.” The amazing achievements of the music, arts, and theatre organizations at the high school are extremely under publicized, she believes. The professionalism and talent found within these groups continues to amaze her year after year.

Currently at Chelmsford High School there are numerous teachers retiring, and younger teachers are coming in. Sandie recalls the days when she could “go down the door in each hall and identify every person teaching.” With the departmentalized concept at CHS, teachers of common disciplines are placed in the same wing of the school. Although the school may have a less personal feel to it, Sandie says that she is extremely excited to have the younger teachers on board. “They are energizing to be around!” she notes. In addition, she says that new English teachers are finding once again the need for a more intense course of grammatical education. “The pendulum seems to be swinging back,” Sandie says. Her extensive work with curriculum building and teacher enhancement makes her an ideal mentor for any new instructor to the Chelmsford Public School system.

In her classroom, Sandie has three rules for her students, which she refers to as the “Three R's”: Respect yourself; Respect each other; Take responsibility for your actions. Each day she learns from her own students, which is one aspect of the job she absolutely loves. If she had to give advice to graduating seniors, the words would come from The Little Engine Who Could – “If you think you can, you can!” Sandie is a firm believer in challenging oneself and always trying new things. Learning is a lifelong process, and she hopes that her students will walk away from her classes knowing that. “You have to fail your way to success!” she motivates. She frequently tells her students, too, that she is learning from them each and every day.

Sandie's personal life is one that demonstrates her extremely strong will and belief that if one can think it, one can achieve it. In 2005 she celebrated her ninth year as a breast cancer survivor. Through counseling others with cancer

and volunteering periodically at the New England Medical Center, Sandie wants to drive home the message that, "There is life beyond cancer!" Upon retirement Sandie would like to become very active as a volunteer with the New England Medical Center.

A second misfortune struck Sandie and her husband in 2002. Both were severely injured in a motorcycle accident. Sandie suffered a broken leg in four spots, a crushed ankle and later an infected leg. For eight months she was wheelchair bound and unable to return to work for the school year. "It was my second home at CHS that helped get me through," she states, with co-workers and friends providing everything from grocery delivery to transportation to appointments. When seeing Sandie today, the bright look on her face and the enthusiasm in her voice show no pain from the past. Her inner strength shines outward.

Sandie's love of the English language extends well beyond the classroom walls. Daily journaling is a habit that Sandie continues to explore. During the past summer months, she and fellow teacher Beverly McCoy exchanged writing prompts via email, with weekly chats regarding their composing. She is also an avid reader and part of a book club. Books she recommends from past readings include *The Kite Runner*, *Snow in August*, and *Their Eyes Were Watching God*. In addition, she is active with a theatre group, and has also taken up painting and quilting.

Our news is filled with tales of students who fail, low test scores, and negativity with regard to high schools. Sandie is quick to note that one cannot focus on the negative. "There are so many great kids at our school!" she says, and insists that one must remain focused on the positive. With a teacher like Sandie Taylor at their side, the students are sure to succeed. ■

ATHLETIC CORNER

In what has become almost a tradition, the volleyball team was champions of the Merrimack Valley Conference (MVC) for the sixth time in the last seven seasons. In so doing, Coach Dana Defilippo reached the 300-win mark.

Five teams were second place finishers in the MVC: football, boys' cross country, girls' cross country, golf, and girls' swimming and diving. Three of the five potential teams qualified for the state tournament: field hockey, golf, and girls' volleyball. Aquatic performers excelled, with two swimmers and a diver becoming state champs, one in two events. The girls' swimming and diving team finished second in the state meet.

As usual, individual honors were plentiful. Five athletes were chosen Boston Globe or Boston Herald All-Scholastics. Four players were chosen as their sports' Player of the Year. Sixty-one athletes were chosen as All-Star or All-Conference athletes in the MVC. Eighteen participants were chosen as Lowell Sun All Stars – the most from any community.

The percentage of student participation remained high, with thirty-five percent of the study body involved. Ten programs were offered and twenty-four teams were fielded. ■

Our winter sports season is underway. Looking back, we had 619 or 35% of our student body participate in programs offered by our Athletic Department. The girls' volleyball team won the MVC for the 6th time in seven years. The girls swimming and diving team finished second in the state and had three athletes receive Globe All-Scholastic recognition: Amanda Cecere, Katelyn Martin and Rachel Martinez.

Our marching band received the highest award ever in fall competition. Our Theatre Guild put on a fine production of the comedy "The Foreigner." All of our musical groups provided an excellent winter concert. The band, orchestra and chorus also had a large number of students qualify for district recognition and to audition for state honors. Our art students are preparing entries for the Boston Globe Scholastic Art Competition. So, student involvement in the arts continues to be significant.

Several state schools, including the University of Massachusetts at Lowell, now offer on site admissions programs. If the student provides the college or university with required information, they are given immediate acceptance. This is a great new service to our students. UMASS-Lowell was so pleased with the event that they are scheduled to return to CHS for another day of interviews and processing of applications.
